

Faculty Teaching Loads - Policy 135

In order to facilitate and ensure the University commitment to excellence in teaching and research, scholarship, and service to the broader community, each full-time Academic Staff Member will be expected to undertake a full-time teaching load as defined in this policy.

Related Policy Employee Appointments

Definitions

Credit means the equivalent of one hour of instruction per week.

A full-time Academic Staff Member means an employee of the University responsible for direct instruction of students at the University.

Regulations

A full-time Academic Staff Member will be expected to undertake a teaching load which is the equivalent of six three-credit courses in any academic year. Part of this teaching load may, with the agreement of the faculty member and Chief Academic Officer, be replaced with defined administrative or other duties.

The Chief Academic Officer will consider the number of unique subject preparations a full-time AFM must manage in their assignment of teaching load and not assign more than three different preparations.
